
The Hearth



Chipola Family Ministries, off Florida 71 in Marianna will remain open also for storm victims and will transition to a warming shelter Tuesday through Thursday.


A.D. Harris Learning Center in **Panama City** will open as a warming shelter, Tuesday through Thursday.

The Point-in-Time Count (PIT) is an Annual Census of people experiencing homelessness in Northwest Florida. PIT is a crucial initiative aimed at understanding and addressing homelessness by conducting an accurate and comprehensive count of homeless individuals to gain valuable insights into their unique needs and challenges. This knowledge, in turn, enables us to create more effective strategies to prevent and end homelessness in Northwest Florida.

How Can I Help?

There are several volunteer roles for the Point-in-Time Count. Here are some ways you can help:

- Interview people experiencing homelessness using the Counting Us Mobile App
- Identify known locations where people experiencing homelessness stay using the Counting Us Mobile App
- Be a County or Team Lead to help plan and coordinate activities in your community
