CoC General Meeting Minutes

August 14, 2024 Grace Presbyterian Church

Michael Thomas opened the meetings by asking for approval of the July 10 CoC General Meeting- Motion made by Rhonda Rose 2nd by Kay Daniel. Membership approved.

Tracy Peters discussed DCF Funding and NOFO. DCF /Challenge and ESG grants will be due by August 19. Tracy explained the scoring process.

Vicki Abrams (Two Fish- Gulf County) introduced Pattie Medlock Introduction of Pattie Medlock, Under Secretary for DCF, and Erek Culbreath-DCF - Director of Homelessness (remotely). Discussions about the relationship of the CoC and DCF and the funding received from the State. Discussion on how the Grant dollars can be spent. The importance of the HMIS system and the data that is required by DCF and HUD.

Also discussed was Bill 1365(encampments see attached Bill). A lively question and answer session went to further discuss the bill. Several recipients of the FY23/24 DCF Challenge dollars gave muchneeded help, especially to the outer counties.



About Matthew's Nursery

Matthew's Nursery provides newborns and babies, in need and up to one year of age, with items to keep them clean, warm, comfortable, and safe. Families are given a layette basket for their newborn to meet their basic needs such as diapers, bottles, bibs, lotion, shampoo/baby wash, sleepers, wipes and other necessities. Layettes are distributed between the last month of pregnancy and the first month of the newborn's life.

When available, the nursery provides food, diapers, wipes, and baby items for babies up to one year of age.

Regardless of the reasons behind the need, Matthew's Nursery - as well as all of the services offered by Catholic Charities of Northwest Florida - is here to help anyone in need regardless of race, religion, or national origin.

Matthew Jesse Pitts was born at just 29 weeks with a chromosomal syndrome and multiple heart and intestinal issues. Matthew - whose name means "Gift from God," was stillborn. He was immediately baptized and spent several hours with his family. Little Matthew was cherished from his very conception and into the final hours following his birth.
